


My first new year's resolution is to get these reports in on time. I need to work on that.

SHOVING OFF

New Year's Resolutions



OK, let me start out by saying, I don't make New Year's resolutions. Never have. It's just that today is New Year's Day, and more than is usual, I am thinking about the year ahead and what it holds. About a year ago, I presented the lovely and gracious Mrs. St. John with an exit plan – things we needed to square away before we quit the working life and take off on a new life of cruising and exploring. The list looked like this:

- Reach 59-1/2
- Receive check for the sale of Cablecraft
- Pay off debt
 - Subaru
 - Truck
 - Line of Credit
 - Credit Card



- Must Do Boat Mods
 - New Chain
- Plan for Rylie
- Plan for mom
- Plan for insurance



Mrs. S's immediate comment was "we don't have much control over this!" I pointed out that if we just stayed alive, we would hit the first one easy! I also explained that not everything had to happen to pull the exit trigger.

Well, it's almost a year later. We both turned 60 in December. Turning 59-1/2 is important for tax reasons. We aren't old enough for social security so being able to withdraw retirement savings without penalty is pretty important.

The anchor chain is on the boat. That was my only "must improve". Still, we've improved the radar, auto pilot, AIS, and VHF as well. Also, I know that, while the CQR anchor has served this boat for many years, I would feel much better with a modern Rocna or Mantus on the bow. We'd also like a better heating for when we're on the hook and I think we need to relook at the antenna situation on the short-wave radio and figure out how to run the water maker. Really though, La Sirena is ready to cross oceans now (and Mrs. S promises me we aren't crossing any oceans.)

Selling the house and moving on board put money in the bank which we haven't touched. It's also allowed us to pay off remaining debts at a rate of about \$3,000 a month. We didn't even really start in earnest until last July. By July 2020 we should be 100% debt free! That's \$36,000 a year we don't need and that's a lot.

One thing we have zero control over is Cablecraft. Cablecraft is my former employer and I was lucky or wise enough to have invested a bit of money in it when I worked there. They sold one third of the company a bit more than two years ago. That money paid for a good bit of La Sirena. They will sell the other two thirds some day and I would predict soon, but I won't know until the deal is done and I can't say what it will be worth.

Here things get tough!

As most of you are aware, Rylie, our five-year-old granddaughter lives with us. Always has and maybe always will. We don't know and it isn't a showstopper. Growing up on a boat, home schooled, is not a bad way to go. Julie's mom is sort of in a similar category. She is in Portland and Julie visits monthly to take care of shopping, organizing meds, and the like. She may move to Tacoma soon. Again, we'll deal with it, but making a monthly trip to Oregon from Alaska or Mexico can be challenging.

Insurance? Well it's just something to sort out.

So here we are. January 1st, 2020. La Sirena is largely ready to go. Mrs. S has exactly two shifts left and she is retired (meaning, if you are reading this, she is retired.) I've hired my replacement at work. He may not know it, but he is way more than capable of replacing me. The clock is ticking. We're watching videos of others who have taken the plunge. We're ready to join them. Just don't hold your breath for our YouTube channel!
