Although the crew member was not fully submerged and never became separated from the boat, she managed to hold on to the crew member around the chest. Not being able to pull the crew member up and over the lifelines, she used the Life Sling around the crew member's chest and was then able to hold on belay-style until further help arrived. Well done to all who assisted in the rescue.

I would like to welcome Eric and Amy Johnson as new Active Members. They have a J35 called "Flicka" which is Swedish for "girl" and was named in memory of Eric's father.

As I stated in the December Mainsheet, the Board will be working on the 2020 Budget short fall, and what will need to happen to get the Club on the road into the black. The Bylaws Officers Duties will also be under revision, as well as Elections and Nominations,

I hope you all had fun at the Commodore's Ball! It was a great turnout and a fun welcome for Angie as the new Commodore! Aside from the Ball, January was a little slow except for the Duwamish Head Race we did on Goes to 11.

Speaking of, what a fun race! The start was quite chaotic for us, as we have issues raising the main, and with the rough water and wind blowing in the 20s, it took us about 15 minutes to get the main

up. Hopefully we have it figured out now and can easily raise it next time. But it was a great time, and we got 1st in class! Our CYCT teams are doing pretty well in the team category as well. Be sure to check out my video of the race!

We had a few issues after the race including getting the boat back! When we finished, we decided to leave the boat in Des Moines and bring it back later in the week. After several days of heavy wind and potential snow, we were finally able to get it back. And even that was eventful when the winds picked up to over 20 knots from the south halfway back. Yet another day in the water, and we finally got to pull the boat out the next day.

When was the last time you replaced your lines? I raise the keel when we haul the boat during the winter, and the internal crane that raises the keel has a large spectra line (which should hold about 20,000 pounds). Well, when we brought the boat back, I started raising the keel and BOOM! The spectra line exploded! I'm not sure how it happened, but all I can say is


