

SHOVING OFF

Kids on Boats



Raising a child on the boat was not really a part of the live aboard plan. Maybe I'm naïve? The Toot has lived with us since she was born. She was part of most boat buying trips. We just didn't think we'd still be parenting at this point. Don't get me wrong – grandpa would be lost without his little buddy. It just required adjustments.

The first adjustment is safety, and the number one safety item – PFDs. Yes, plural, with an S. We have three in rotation. One for the boat and one for each car. When outside of the enclosures, a PFD is worn. Toot has yet to go in, but her little cousin has! We are careful to get PDFs with head flotation. Crotch straps and handles in the back are fairly standard. Swim lessons with the Lovely and Gracious Mrs. S are in near future.

Then there are books and toys. Luckily La Sirena is, well, voluminous. Books are in a large basket on the saloon floor. A copy of *Brown Bear*, *Brown Bear* and *Little Toot* are always in reach. Crayons and playdough have a dedicated location. Many people use a net "hammock" for storing fruit. We have one in the vee-berth full of toys.

Speaking of vee-birth, ours has a tent. Maybe one of Toot's favorite items, she has a tent on her bed. Actually (her current, favorite word), the tent takes up about 60% of the bed. It's her place to curl up and play or sleep. Unfortunately, it can be tough for grandma and grandpa when we fall asleep in the tent.

One boat adjustment for the whole family has been TV! Yes, I know all about screen time, no letters please. We don't watch lots of television, but we watch almost nightly for an hour or less. It's our "cuddle up

together and unwind time." Unfortunately, we don't have cable or satellite and the antenna only picks up one religious channel and the Korean channel. We use a Fire Stick and DVDs. At the house we had two or three DVDs. Now we have dozens. Monthly trips to the thrift store and Ebay have left us well stocked. On YouTube, the Toot is partial to a nature show hosted by Coyote Peterson. Grandma and grandpa watch several sailing blogs; SV Delos, Sailing with Ran, and The Adventures of a Seadog. Grandpa also like a show on narrow boating called "Cruising the Cut." I find it relaxing and she finds it boring enough to put her to sleep.



Awake time is spent several ways. Just as with her mom and my other four children, much of the Toot's time is spent helping grandpa work on things or helping grandma cook. "Little Boat Rides" are very popular, as is looking over the edge into the water. We have a budding marine biologist in the making. I think she may know more than me! Pulling a dangling (for years) dock line out of the water provides hours of looking and poking at an underwater world brought to the surface.

I would be remiss if I didn't address discipline. The Toot is a very precocious and strong willed four-year-old who needs a bit of correction. I raised my adult children with various levels of corporal discipline as well as other creative measures. I'm older and, if not wiser, gentler. Corporal

punishment is out leaving the popular "time out." My daughter prefers having Toot stand in a corner. Appropriate corners are hard to come by on a boat. Me, I favor uncomfortable spots. My daughter almost grew up sitting on a cold, hard hearth (when the wood stove was out.) La Sirena comes with a spiral staircase the makes a lousy seat and excellent time out spot. The microwave is nearby for setting a timer. Usually two minutes does the trick.

Raising a little girl on a boat is a challenge but a worthwhile endeavor as well. Another year or so, we may be looking at home schooling! One thing she'll be is one heck of a mariner.
