# Important Notice from CYCT Racing RACERS PLEASE READ:

CYCT Racers,

Since the start of this year's racing season, we have impeded commercial vessel traffic <u>four times</u>. This is becoming a huge issue for the race committee. From the Commercial vessels' and RC's view, this is a safety issue to all concerned.

This is also a matter of maritime courtesy and sharing the water. I have had more than one conversation with Vessel Traffic and ship's pilots. They see this as a safety problem.

I fear if we cannot resolve this issue, our racing program could be at stake.

The CYCT Race committee is therefore taking the following actions:

If a vessel engaged in a race impedes commercial traffic, the race committee may:

- 1. DISQUALIFY offending race vessels.
- 2. POSTPONE races until there is not a conflict with commercial traffic.
- 3. ABANDON races if RC sees the problem not being resolved.
- 4. SUSPEND the offending boat from racing in CYCT sanctioned events for a period of time to be determined by the CYCT board.

Remember, we all share the water, please be safe minded and courteous skippers.

We must fix this or it will be "fixed" by others.


