Hi CYCT!

It's (finally) been a nice summer, and we've managed to get in some racing and cruising for everyone to enjoy!

BIG Thanks to Don Kimball and Rich Morales for keeping the race committee ship-shape. And of course, to all the race volunteers on Romeo Charlie, you have our appreciation as well.

Some business –

If you didn't hear, we had to disqualify 2 boats from the Ruston Classic 3 Hour Tour Race, due to interference with commercial traffic. It seems that this is becoming more of a problem. We need EVERYONE to pay attention to commercial vessels on the racecourse and stay WELL CLEAR. This is not only for your safety, but the safety of your crew. This is also the LAW. A good rule of thumb is that if you can't see the ship's bridge, they can't see you. This should not be your only guiding principle, but one of them. I personally try to stay a minimum of 300 yards from any commercial vessel, even if this means I must abandon the race.

I can tell you with certainty, that if one of the commercial vessels blows their horn at you during the race, you WILL BE DISQUALIFIED. No questions, no protest, no discussion. The CYCT Race committee has the full support of the Bridge officers and the board in this matter. Please be respectful of our commercial neighbors, and don't put the race committee in the position of having to disqualify you.

Please take this seriously, friends. This could potentially impact our race program in the future. We must permit each race we run with the Coast Guard, and if the Puget Sound Pilots, Crowley, etc. start complaining about us, the USCG \*may\* deny our race permits.

On another serious note: PINK BOAT REGATTA is coming!! September 17th is the day! The Pink Boat board is very grateful for the partnership with CYCT and looks forward to having another awesome year. Please get your boats registered and get your friends, family, everyone donating!! You do not need to be a "racing" boat to participate. All are welcome. If you need help registering, please let me know! More info to come in the next Mainsheet!
