Treasurer Report

WHERE DO OUR DUES GO?

We report our revenues and bank balances every month. However, members who aren't participants in committees or the board may wonder how the club's revenue gets invested. Here's a quick summary of the 2022 budget, which was approved in February.

We collect fees for dues (55% of revenue), racing (25%), dinghy storage (9%), logo wear (2%), and the Commodore's Ball (9%). This is how the expenses were allocated:

7% of expenses - Tyee Land rent (clubhouse and trailer storage)

1% - Tyee clubhouse maintenance

4% - Cruising

7% - Dinghy storage

4% - Holiday party

12% - Commodore's Ball

1% - Daffodil parade

1% - Summer picnic

12% - Insurance (marine and general)

1% - Miscellaneous

5% - Committee expenses (Membership, Treasurer, Sunshine, Flag Officers)

3% - PayPal

1% - Professional organizations

3% - Romeo Charlie fuel

12% - Romeo Charlie maintenance

7% - Romeo Charlie moorage

3% - Trophies

4% - Reciprocal moorage

4% - CYCT Website and electronic communication

8% - Fund the reserve for eventual replacement of Romeo Charlie and/or its engine


