

Hello All,

Spring has gone and left us quickly. Summer is now here. This means long days of sunshine well into the evening. Perfect for sailing (and more specifically racing) if you ask me. We have already concluded our Early Spring and Late Spring series of Wednesday evening racing. We now move on to the second half of our season of Wednesday night races. But that is not all. Several Saturday races will "dot" the calendar for the remainder of the season as well. Among the upcoming Saturday races are the 3 Hour Tour Series as well as our Vashon Challenge distance race. We look forward to seeing everyone out on the water competing. Let's make it a great summer of racing.

I want to thank all our competitors for their patience this year, especially in our Late Spring Series which was plagued with challenges. The biggest of which was the loss of our committee boat for 3 consecutive Wednesdays. Not being able to secure a different option we were forced to use my vessel (S/V Lucia) which was really limited in what it could provide. With it we were able to get a starting line with a single rounding but nothing more. Big thanks to Paul Grove for getting our committee boat back out on the water. With it we have the ability to set 3 temporary pins plus anchor the boat all in depths of 200+ feet. This gives us many different options for setting up a race-course.

I also want to acknowledge an area where we, as a whole, have improved and that is staying clear of vessel traffic entering and leaving Port of Tacoma Waterways. So, thank you Skippers for doing your part. For our part on race committee, we contact vessel traffic at 4:00pm on race day and receive a schedule of any commercial traffic entering or exiting the port. We have also settled into a starting line area between Hylebos and Blair Waterways which leaves enough room for Tug/Tow traffic to traverse either side of us safely. Let's all keep up the good work here.

As a reminder Romeo Charlie still needs volunteers for the remainder of the season. Both for our Wednesday series and our Saturday races. Thank you to all who have volunteered so far this season. Skippers, if you haven't already, please consider having one of your crew members sign up to volunteer once this season.


